## Featured Workshop Project Jim Pozzobon - Rockin' Boat -


What do you do as a proud Woodworker Grandpa when you are lucky enough to have two wonderful grandchildren? Why - you build a fabulous "Rockin' Boat" of course. Evee and Freddy (latest addition to the Pozzobon clan) will be treated this Easter to the best gift of love that any fine woodworking Grandpa could create. Working in his shop for over150 hours (impressive), Jim Pozzobon crafted this amazing gift. Starting with a pine frame and then sheeted with Birch plywood in 1/8" and 1/4" thicknesses, Jim based the one-quarter scale rocker on his own Lund fishing craft. Details match Jim's fishing boat in every

respect: floor carpeting, padded seat, steering wheel, windshield, instruments and a scaled Honda motor all add to the realism. The elevated decks open for storage. Finished with eight coats of acrylic spray paint, sanded between coats, and ultimately topped off with a clear semi poly coat. the final touch was matching decals created by a friend. Simply A-W-E-S-O-M-E work, Jim!

# FROM THE VINTAGE TOOL TRUNK

Our monthly meetings feature a Show-and-Share segment. Virgil Parvu had us all intrigued with this item from his collection of vintage tools. It is a rare Dremel MotoTool, electric coping saw, that is not often seen today.

Research led to the following interesting details:

- Dremel was founded in Racine, Wisconsin in 1932 with a rotary 'engraver' tool, the forerunner of today's tool.
- The Dremel company struggled during the Great Depression of the late 1930s.
- Post World War 2, Dremel noted a growing interest in "hobbies" and looked for ways to diversify the business.
- A huge jigsaw puzzle craze led to new stamped cardboard puzzles in the 1930s, yet wooden jigsaw puzzles and shaped wooden puzzles for children (farm and zoo animals) were still much sought after.
- In 1947, Dremel decided to entice woodworkers with an interest in making wooden puzzles by producing an "electric,hand-held scroll saw" as an economical entry point.
- The device was first advertised in 1948 for Christmas sales.
- Dremel increased production in 1950 but regular scroll saws pushed the device to the sidelines.
- · Amazingly, an updated version of this saw is still available through a select few Dremel distributors.

2 x 4 Challenge

All fully paid members of the Club are invited to take part in the 2 x 4 Challenge. Final projects must be presented at the Club meeting on Thursday, May 30, 2024.

### Contest Guidelines:

- Your projects must be built from a single construction grade 2 x 4 no more than 8' in length.
- 2. You can build anything or everything that you want, as long as it is constructed from the 2 x 4.
- 3. Multiple items can be built usng the same 2 x 4.
- 4. Your project does not have to use the entire 2 x 4.
- Screws, nails, dowels, and dominoes are all accepted forms of joinery.
- Any finishing method is allowed (Poly, Shellac, Stain, Paint, Wax, etc.).
- No other materials are allowed. Any use of leather, metal banding, plywood, knobs, etc. will result in disqualification.

**Voting:** for the best projects will be done by club members present for this meeting using a three-place ranked ballot system..
